A Thought From Mark...

If fully lived out, even one verse of Scripture can make an incredible difference amongst God's people. We have been studying in this space a great example of this - 1 Corinthians 15:58...

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

Last week we emphasized the words "my beloved brothers" and how they set the tone for all the commands and instructions that follow. Today we look at the first imperative Paul gives in this powerful verse - "be steadfast."

Note once more that this is a command, not a wish or a helpful suggestion. Based on all that has gone before in this great chapter that proclaims the resurrection of Christ and his followers, and set in the context of a love relationship with one another in the church, Paul the apostle of Jesus commands steadfastness.

What does it mean to be steadfast? I think of firmness. Of unwavering commitment. Of true blue loyalty. It seems to be a big deal among the NT writers. They often called for it, sometimes using different words and different images. Being firm in Christ. Not being tossed back and forth by every wind. Being loyal to the Lord and to His church.

Why should we be so? Why not be taken wherever the wind blows us? Why be concerned with loyalty to our calling in the church?

Well, if we think about what God is like, we might find our answer. One of the primary traits of the LORD God is His steadfast love - His loyalty to His people – His firmness of character and truth and holiness. Being steadfast is being like our God.

Being steadfast is also being like our Savior. Jesus was firm, determined, focused, never taken off course. He was steadfastly obedient to His Father, and fiercely loyal to His disciples. His love did not waver, even under the most extreme test. His faith never faltered, His trueness never failed.

In light of all this, we as children of God and disciples of Jesus must strive to be steadfast. This is not the spirit of our age, and so this is difficult. It is much easier to go with the flow, to waffle and waver at every turn, to run from here to there whenever things get rough. But the command of the Lord through His servant Paul remains: if you would be a person with a resurrection in your future: Be Ye Steadfast.

Proverbs 14:31; Proverbs 17:5; Proverbs 19:17; Proverbs 21:13; Proverbs 22:9,16,22; Proverbs 28:27; Proverbs 29:7,14; Proverbs 31:9,20.

An additional suggestion would be to look at every passage in the Bible with the word "poor" in it and see how the word is used in each passage.

The International Standard Bible Encyclopedia further explains the use of this term in both Old and New Testaments.

As Christians, we should be willing to help the poor "according to our ability" to do so (Acts 11:29).
