

A Thought From Mark...

The concluding phrase and imperative of 1 Corinthians 15:58 is an interesting one, because it is a command to know something...

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, KNOWING THAT IN THE LORD YOUR LABOR IS NOT IN VAIN."

We all have times when we wonder whether our work in the church is doing any good. Congregations go through seasons where we question if our labor is in vain. Such are the times to remember this little verse of Scripture, and its important closing exhortation: YOUR WORK IS NOT IN VAIN!

When Jesus died on the cross that dark Friday, the disciples went into mournful hiding convinced it was all over for them. Three and a half years of their lives given for what? A dead rabbi? Family ties cut, for what? Careers abandoned, to what end? Now they were among Jerusalem's most wanted – they felt they could count their remaining lives in minutes, days at best!

But it was only Friday – Sunday was coming! For on Sunday – the very first Lord's Day – the Lord of Life rose from the tomb triumphant! History changed! Their lives and their labors were indeed NOT in vain they were full of new meaning and purpose. They would never again question such.

So it us with us. Hard times come at us. We struggle. At times we fail. We wonder if serving God is really worth the grief and toil. And then Sunday comes, and we are reminded of the risen Savior - and our hope is renewed - and we are convicted of the truth that our labor indeed is not in vain.

For this reason we will be steadfast, and immovable; and we will always abound in the work of the Lord. Because Jesus rose from the dead on the third day we will stick with it, and not be swayed by every wind; and we will continue to offer our lives as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God.

Our work in Christ through His church has more meaning and import than any other labor we may involve ourselves in. Our efforts have eternal consequences unto the saving of souls! If Jesus rose from the grave, and He did, we know that our labor in the Lord is not in vain.

CHURCH WEBSITE UPDATE – PERSONAL **DATA FORM**


Hopefully you have noticed that the church's website (www.36thstreetchurch.com or 36thstchurchofchrist.com) has been changed and updated.
