

A Thought From Mark...

[I hope you enjoy this letter of thanks from one of our young sisters in Christ at OVU.]

36th Street Church of Christ,

This past May, Wes Harrison, Glenna Harrison, Dennis Cox, Eleanor Hardy, and I had the opportunity to spend one month in Harbin, China teaching conversational English to the Chinese students at Heilongjiang University. All of our students were kind and curious, asking many questions about the Bible and our lives back at home in America. While some individuals knew of Christianity, others were hearing about it for the very first time.

The hardest part of teaching was when I had to define certain ideas to my students, such as being a 'lost person,' salvation, and eternity. Having frequently heard these terms growing up in the church, I found it difficult to explain these concepts and the reasoning behind them to someone who had no previous knowledge of the Bible. Regardless, my students listened attentively and did their best to understand, which I appreciated.

In addition to teaching one on one, my mission team visited with John Paul and Rachel Suchecki, who then were full-time missionaries in Harbin. On Sundays and Wednesdays, they would hold Bible studies in their home, to which we would invite our Chinese students. I enjoyed getting to know the Suchecki family; my favorite part of our trip was always going to their house on Sunday mornings, because Rachel would make a delicious American breakfast!

While I had missed being in America, leaving China was bittersweet as well. On our last day in Harbin, we had a going away party with our students. Everyone was giving each other hugs while recounting their experiences with one another through tears and laughter. I felt so blessed to meet the people that I did and to form deeper friendships with my missionary team.

Going to China was an experience that continues to benefit my life today. I thank everyone at 36th Street once again for your prayers and support of this mission trip. We had a wonderful time in Harbin, China, while spreading the love of Christ to those we met.

The zoo hours are 9 AM—5 PM. Those who are still remaining at the close of the zoo will carpool back home. We will make a stop on the way home for dinner.






