A Thought From Mark...

Lane Adams once compared the process of spiritual growth to the strategy the Allies used in World War II to liberate islands in the South Pacific. First they would soften up an island, weakening the resistance by shelling the enemy strongholds with bombs from offshore ships.

Next, a small group of Marines would invade the island and establish a *beachhead*—a tiny fragment of the island that they could control. Once the beachhead was secured, they would begin the long process of liberating the rest of the island, one bit of territory at a time. Eventually the entire island would be brought under control, but not without some costly battles.

Adams drew this parallel: Before Christ invades our lives at conversion, he sometimes has to soften us up by allowing problems we can't handle. While some open their lives to Christ the first time He knocks on the door, most of us are resistant and defensive. Our preconversion experience is Jesus saying, "Behold! I stand at the door and bomb!"

The moment you open yourself to Christ, God gets a beachhead in your life. You may think you have surrendered all your life to Him, but the truth is, there's a lot to your life of which you aren't aware. You can give God only as much of you as you understand at that moment. That's OK.

Once Christ is given a beachhead, He begins the campaign to take over more and more territory until all of your life is completely His. There will be struggles and battles, but the outcome never will be in doubt. God has promised that "He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 1:6).

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

I want to begin by thanking each one of you who made our journey in September and October a wonderful experience. Those who kept us in your homes, provided transportation and food, and provided expense money for the trip.

You love the gospel of Christ, and Europe has a great need to hear it. The congregation in Verviers was happy to have us back, and we have found that everyone in the congregation was at his/her post, doing what was necessary during our long absence.

As we have said, the bond of friendship and fellowship with the converts from Luxembourg becomes stronger each week. Last Sunday, Suzanne and I drove to Luxembourg following our worship in the morning.

We are preparing, with several brethren, to travel to St. Albain, near the center of France, for an annual meeting of brethren. This will take place toward the end of November or the beginning of December.

I preached last Sunday on the duties of parents toward their children. I cited a passage from the Christian writer, Tertullian of Carthage, about 200 A.D., which reads as follows: "Lead your children to Jesus. When they grow up, let them learn Christian teachings, when they are taught the final goal toward which they are walking, let them become Christians." This is from a tract on baptism, written by Tertullian. This implies the responsibility of fathers toward their children, and is from the Scriptures, Deuteronomy 11:18, 19).

I can't close this letter without mentioning the terrorist events which have occurred in France and Belgium recently. The level of security has been heightened to the highest point, and we are all trying to be careful. The police and the army are patrolling the streets and reassuring the population here. The work of the church is continuing.
