LYN: Next Door Commitment

Are you ready to make a commitment to love your neighbor next door? We have been focusing on loving our neighbors and now it is time for you to decide that you want to live as a good neighbor.

Making this commitment is important. Deciding something in advance will help us make the right decisions when an opportunity arises. We often have opportunities to get to know or to show love to our neighbors, but it is easy to ignore them. Make a commitment now that you will take advantage of those opportunities this year. You will be making a commitment to live like Jesus wants us to live.

This week's lesson in the adult bible classes is "WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?" In this lesson we will explore whom we should love as our neighbor. The scriptures teach that anyone in need is neighbor. In this lesson we will suggest we should start with the obvious "next door neighbors." We will work to identify who our next door neighbors are as the first step in our plan.

Remember from the last lesson that love is the power of God's Kingdom and now we should use that power on our next door neighbors. Consider John

13:34-35:

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.

By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

"Ask rain from the LORD in the season of the spring rain, from the LORD who makes the storm clouds, and he will give them showers of rain, to everyone the vegetation in the field" (Zechariah 10:1).
