LYN: Next Door How

We have all seen diet plans and self-help plans. Why are

us a few steps we can take to reach our goal. Our goal this year is to love our next door neighbors. Having a simple plan to do that will help us.

Here is the three star '

neighbors.

- 1. **Identify Our Neighbors** Have you identified the people you would consider your next door neighbors? If you don't know which ones you are going to think of as neighbors, it will be pretty hard to get to know them or to love them. So, clearly identify those you want to reach as neighbors.
- 2. **Know Our Neighbors** Are you getting to know your neighbors? It will take some special effort on your part to talk to them and spend time with them. You will want to love your neighbors if you know them better.
- 3. **Love Our Neighbors** Have you started doing things for your neighbors? Serving them requires paying attention and taking advantage of opportunities to show love.

Having a plan is great, but is only useful if you follow it. Follow the plan and start living everyday like Jesus wants us to.

What does it take to Love Your Neighbor? Seeing!

Isaiah coined the phrase "see and see, but do not perceive." He meant that people had eyes, but they didn't see reality. They missed the point. They had 20-20 vision but what they saw never reached their consciousness.

Most of us can plead guilty to the insight from Isaiah 6:9. We see people all around us, but we miss repeated opportunities to connect. We walk by the hurting. We ignore the neglected. We treat neighbors as if they were the invisible man.

We can hardly love our neighbor as ourselves when we don't really see them.

Isaiah's comment suggests a meaningful strategy:

- When people talk, listen.
- When a person enters our zone, take a good look.
- When we come face to face with a neighbor, move beyond the visual to perception.
- Loving your neighbor as yourself begins with truly seeing them.

Our Weakness is God's Strength

One common reason we hear for not sharing the gospel is, "I don't know all the answers." For some this is just an excuse, but for others it is a very real concern. We don't want to give wrong information out of ignorance, and we don't want to appear doubtful. But if we wait until we know ALL the answers, we will never share our faith with anyone. What is the solution to this dilemma?

First, stop thinking of yourself as a teacher, and remember you are just a Christian sharing the message of God with a non-Christian. God takes the burden off our shoulders by making His Word the authority. We don't have to be an "expert;" we only have to be a Christian who knows how and why we are saved.

Second, remember that we DO have all the answers...in the Bible! Giving an immediate and scholarly answer to every question an unbeliever asks is not nearly as important as instilling in them the confidence that the answer is available in God's Word. Searching together for the answer may be a very meaningful and important experience for both of you.

Third, our humble admission, to ourselves and our "students," that we don't know all the answers, can be a very effective tool in sharing the gospel. It takes the emphasis off the messenger and places it on the message, where the real power lies.

A warning: Because God's strength is made manifest in our weakness is no reason to continue in that weakness. Daily Bible study and a steadily increasing knowledge of God's Word and His will for us are important goals.

Let us make ourselves available to God, so that through His wisdom and the power of His Scriptures He might use us as tools to further His kingdom. I will never have a "perfect" knowledge of the Scriptures, but "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth ma!" (Philimping 4-12) Christ which strengtheneth me!" (Philippians 4:13)

7 THINGS THAT WILL HELP YOU GROW SPIRITUALLY

by the late Grover Stevens

- 1 LIVE and WORK to reach others each day as if you knew the world were going to come to an end next Sunday night. Think of that feeling of urgency and priority! (*Read 2 Peter 3:1-12*).
- **2 BE AS ENTHUSIASTIC** about the church and its services as you would be if there were an overflowing crowd each time. Think of the interest, anticipation, and excitement of an overflow crowd!
- **3 COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS.** Make a list of the things you are thankful to God for and thank Him for them one by one as you pray in your closet. This will help you to be grateful (*Philippians 4:6*). It will also help you to realize your dependence on God (*Acts 17:24-25,28; John 15:5*).
- **4 MAKE & MAINTAIN A LIST OF YOUR FAULTS.** And pray for forgiveness and help to overcome them as you truly strive to overcome them. This will help us see that we are really not as good as we think we are and how very much we really do need Christ for Savior. It will also help you to sympathize with the faults of others (*James 5:16; Galatians 6:1*).
- **5 KEEP A QUIET TIME.** Set aside 30 minutes every day to spend with God in prayer, Bible study, and meditation. If you really love someone or a game you want to spend some time with them. Just so, if you truly love God you want to spend some time alone with Him. (*Psalms 1:2; 1 Thessalonians 5:17; Luke 18:1*). First century Christians kept an "hour of prayer" (*Acts 13:1*).
- **6 VISIT SOMEONE FOR CHRIST EACH WEEK.** Visit some member you do not know very well; or a sick person; or a visitor to our services; or a weak member who needs encouragement; or someone who needs to become a Christian.
- 7 REACH ANOTHER PERSON (RAP). Conduct a Bible class in your home once a month and invite your relatives, friends and neighbors to attend. The preacher or elders will assist you if you want them to. *Matt.* 5:12-15; *James* 5:20; *Daniel* 12:3.
