God is My Pilot

If we are offering ourselves as living sacrifices to God, and if we are filled with and led by His Spirit, we will not be able to conceal the reason for the hope that is within us, even when unexpected opportunities present themselves.

Several years ago one of our brothers had an experience that illustrates this principle. Jim was driving a tanker with a full load of chemicals on the four-lane one night. He was passing another truck that began to drift into his lane, forcing him into the median. He got his rig back on the highway, but it fishtailed twice, each time coming dangerously close to jackknifing. Jim finally got control of his truck and brought it to a stop beside the road. A co-worker had been following Jim and witnessed the near accident. He pulled off and ran up as Jim was climbing out of his cab. He said, "I've never seen driving like that before!" Jim looked him in the eye and said, "God was driving this truck!"

Jim was not trying to create an opportunity to share his faith that night. And when his co-worker ran up to him, he was not trying to think of what he should say in order to start a religious conversation. Jim was speaking from his heart, but the simple statement he made began a conversation in which he was able to share his faith.

Our opportunities may not be quite as dramatic, but if we would be more open to sharing our feelings about God, we would find many more opportunities to share His Word with others. When God answers a prayer, do we tell the people around us? When something good happens to us, do others hear us praising God? When we are struggling with a problem, do those around us know we are trusting God to help us? If God's Word is guiding and directing our thoughts and actions, we will not be able to avoid sharing it.

"And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:17
