"Lord, Revive Us Again"
Will you not revive us again,
that your people may rejoice in you?

Josiah became a king when he was 8 years old (2 Chronicles 34:1), a seeker at 16 (2 Chronicles 34:3), a reformer at 20 (2 Chronicles 34:3-7), and a humble servant of God at age 26 (2 Chronicles 34:8-33). His dramatic spiritual growth and leadership resulted from listening to God's Word and then **obeying** what he heard (2 Chronicles 34:31).

While the temple in Jerusalem was being repaired and purified, the long-neglected Book of the Law was found and read aloud to young King Josiah (2 Chronicles 34:14-18). When he heard it, he humbled himself, tore his robes, and wept in the presence of God (2 Chronicles 34:19,27).

Josiah realized the enormous sin of those who had led the nation before him, and he decided that deep and lasting change had to begin with him. His public renewal of the covenant — His commitment to follow the Lord and keep His commands, ignited a revival that swept an entire nation (2 Chronicles 34:29-33).

What's wrong with the nation where we live today? Is there greed? Is there violence? Is there indifference toward God? How long has it been sinking into a moral and spiritual quagmire? Are we feeling too young, too old, or too powerless to do anything about it?

Josiah – seeker, reformer, and servant of God – a godly king who wept for his people, has shown us the way. "Lord, revive us again, and let the revival begin with me" (Psalm 85:6).

DRAWING FROM THE PAST

How often do we look back? Reflecting on our past isn't really the trendy thing to do. We most often hear focus on the future! Many associate the past with things obsolete or inferior; distain-worthy. But is it really true the only things worthy of our focus are the things ahead? Sometimes the urge to be entirely forward-focused drives us to minimize the past and fixate entirely on the future. Christians know that indeed we have a glorious future ahead and in the church we want to go forward in our service and devotion to the Lord. However, we also need to recognize the value of the past.

Paul spoke of the past as a resource for present strength; "For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope" (Romans 15:4). And while he also said that he "pressed ahead forgetting those things behind" (Philippians 3:13) we would overstretch the intended meaning of that passage if we say the past is irrelevant. In fact, in the context of Philippians 3 his encouragement to "press forward" is quickly linked with the past when he adds, "only let us hold true to what we have attained" (Philippians 3:16).

The story of the Bible stands as timeless testimony of God's greatness. The grand work of God in history is not temporally locked away never to be accessed. Rather, history is God's domain and as we engage with the record of the past we connect with a source of guidance from above. The fact that God has worked in history, and the record of his working preserved in Scripture, is proof that God intends for us to look back and learn critical lessons about faith. After all, the past is an unfolding tapestry of God's majestic redemptive workings.


