# A Thought From Mark...

Michael Duduit reports:

"In his new book *America at the Crossroads* (Baker Books), George Barna offers a disturbing survey of the trends impacting American culture and the challenges they pose to the church. In one chapter he offers insights about the unchurched, including these data points:

- \* "46 percent of adults are now unchurched an increase from the 35 percent in 2005."
- \* "62 percent of the unchurched consider themselves to be Christian."
- \* "59 percent of Americans disconnect from church life either permanently or for a prolonged period of time between the ages of fifteen and twenty-nine."
- \* "48 percent of the unchurched indicate they are not connected to a church because it provides no value."
- \* "14 percent of unchurched people said they are open to trying a new church."

What do these sad statistics say to us? I suppose we could look at them in one of two ways, or perhaps both. Negatively, it certainly explains why it seems so much harder to get a fair hearing for the Gospel in our culture – why people so rarely respond to our efforts to invite and teach – and why so few seem open to faith.

Positively, we might see that with increasing numbers of unchurched, "unteaching" false denominational doctrines is not nearly as at the front lines as it once was, as most people have little attachment to a church's unique teachings, for the primary reason that they have little attachment to the church period.

Perhaps we can take something from both the positive and negative view here, and realize that a great work lies before us. It is not like the work of previous generations in America — it is much more like a mission work in our own country right now. Perhaps we need to view it that way, study the Scripture from a mission perspective, and adjust accordingly in our efforts to reach a lost world. Maybe the book of Acts can become new and powerful to us once again!

# **Daily Christianity**

"Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts." (Acts 2:46a)

The members of the growing, Spirit-filled first century church did not wake up on Sunday morning and think, "Oh, yeah. Today is the day we have to go to church." They did not have to put up an appearance on Sunday that was different from how they lived during the week with their worldly friends. Theirs was not a Sunday morning religion.

They did not even wait for the first day of the week to praise God, to study His Word, to sing and pray. They went to the temple **every day** for a time set aside to worship the Father. And they didn't practice these daily devotions off by themselves; they met together. This fellowship to which they were devoted did not consist of just waving at each other from across the auditorium once or twice a week.

The concept of walking daily with God is not limited to this passage of Scripture. Daniel set aside three times **every day** when he stopped whatever he was doing and prayed to God (Daniel 6:10). Jesus said, "...If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross **daily** and follow me." (Luke 9:23, emphasis added) The Lord's apostles also exhibited this attitude, as "**Day after day**, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Christ." (Acts 5:42, emphasis added)

If we do not neglect to make opportunities to be together with fellow Christians throughout the week, and to take time to praise God while we are together, we will be edified, encouraged and strengthened in our faith. But also, our non-Christian friends and neighbors will be influenced by our lifestyle, and we will be able to proclaim to them the good news that Jesus is the Christ.

What happened when the first century Christians got together every day? "...the Lord added to their number <u>daily</u> those who were being saved." (Acts 2:47, emphasis added)

In Romans 6:1-2, Paul speaks directly to some folks who were obviously exploiting God's grace: "Shall we continue in sin [keep on sinning] that grace may abound?

He gives a concise answer: "Certainly not!" ["May it never be!"

 Romans 6:2 NASB] and uses an analogy that starkly contrasts death and life: "How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?" (Romans 6:2).

No resurrected Christian from the watery grave of baptism, should be longing to engage in sin (Romans 6:5-6). However, Jude warns us that it is possible to "change the" grace of our God into a license for immorality" (Jude 4

The devil deceives us regarding the "wages of sin" (Romans 6:23), in that sin does not always "appear" to have the stench of death about it (note all of the beer advertisements). In fact, sin can be down-right **appealing** (<u>James 5:5</u>; cf. <u>Hebrews 11:25</u>).

Paul recognized this fact, so he instructs us to: "Reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord" and "Do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts" (Romans 6:11-12).

Beloved, if we truly grasp the marvelous wonder of God's grace for each one of us (Romans 5), we will spend our days sharing it with others (2 Timothy 2:1-2) — never exploiting
