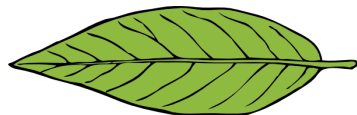
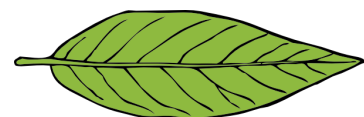

TODAY I WILL . . . Part 1 - Luke 17

*"<sup>11</sup>On the way to Jerusalem . . . <sup>12</sup>And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance <sup>13</sup>and lifted up their voices, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.' <sup>14</sup>When he saw them he said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went they were cleansed. <sup>15</sup>Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; <sup>16</sup>and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. <sup>17</sup>Then Jesus answered, 'Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? <sup>18</sup>Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' <sup>19</sup>And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."*



Today we use leprosy to describe Hanson's disease. In biblical times, it was used of any skin disease, even a severe case of acne. Even a house could have leprosy.

Lepers had to live apart from the community, even their family (cf. Lev. 13:38-46; Num. 5:2-4). They were spiritually unclean. As they approached, they were required to proclaim "unclean, unclean." No one ever touched them. They formed a community of own. As lepers, it made little difference whether one was a Jew or a Samaritan.

Seeing Jesus, they stood at a distance as required by the Law. They addressed Jesus as "Lord," begging him "Have mercy on us."

After healing them Jesus said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." Priests were the community health agents. As they went their way, they were cleansed.

One returned to thank Jesus, a Samaritan. Luke's readers might remember the Good Samaritan and the Gentile mission.

Jesus asks "Where are the nine? Does only this foreigner praise God?" Jesus will say to him, "Your faith has made you well"—literally "saved you."

There are two kinds of healings in this story—from leprosy and from sin.

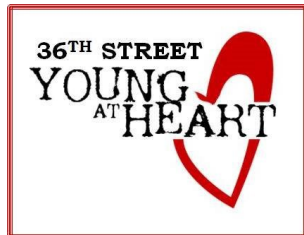
