It Helps to Prepare

William Bridges wrote a book about embracing life's most difficult moments. It's titled *The Way of Transition*. As an expert on the topic of transition, as a world-renowned lecturer on the subject, as a leader in helping businesses navigate transitions—life forced him to deal with a very personal transition. His wife, Mondi, died at the age of 57 (after 37 years of being together). He wrote in this book:

Loss was such a complex experience! Layer after layer of meaning. No won der that, in dream and memory, mourning sent you back over the ground again and again. No wonder mourning took so long to complete and move beyond. No wonder that people who make a change without mourning the loss of the past usually find it confronting them later on, down the road. No wonder that it takes more than a ceremony to lay someone to rest (p. 64).

We live in a grief-illiterate society. Our contemporary culture does not feel comfortable with the subject of loss and its impact. By in large, we don't talk about it. It is threatening to our comfort zone. So, when we suffer loss, we are not equipped to deal with its impact effectively. We are also not equipped to help others. Loss is one of life's harshest blows. It can make us feel like we are going crazy. But we're not; we are grieving.

The best preparation for the storm of loss in life is hearing and doing the will of the Lord (Matthew 7:24-27). The storm will still cause damage, but it will not destroy your life. God's grace is always sufficient (2 Corinthians 12:7-10). When overwhelmed, we need to passionately seek the Lord, our higher ground (Psalm 61:2). An additional form of effective preparation is grief education. Read a good book about it. Talk with others who know about it by experience. Watch videos that discuss it. You will be glad you did.

A preacher for four decades, author and speaker, Dean Miller, lost his beloved wife in 2013 and now conducts Widowhood Workshops around the country, preparing many for the trials of life with loss.
