Before the incredible influence that Christ had across our globe, most governments were run for the power of potentates and not the plight of their people. One warlord would rule as much territory as he could control until ousted by someone stronger. Just as Jesus fulfilled the Law, the church, as Christ's body, fulfills the concern that we who have should show to those in need.

"Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common" Acts 4:32.

All the government social programs and safety nets for those in need that are in place today originally came from the establishment of the church with Jesus as its head and the believers all united in Him. Anything that deviates from this standard found in Acts 4 falls short of the perfect system to govern man.

Within just a few seconds of listening to your TV or news feed will tell you this. Using slightly more civilized methods than the dictators of the past, politicians today **externally** demand wealth from those who have it to help those in need ... and the people of the territories they control are anything but united.

Rather, the church of the 1st Century lived out their oneness in Christ: one body, *one* Spirit, *one* hope, *one* Lord, *one* faith, *one* baptism, and *one* God and Father of all. Because they truly knew the power of our Potentate, the King of Kings, through Him giving of Himself through the gospel for our eternity with Him, they were **internally** motivated to give "to each as any had need."

In an age of low attendance and stretched budgets, it's nice to have government help programs to point people to when they are in need, but we're really sending them to a version of what the Lord's church should be in the 21st Century. By faith, we should instead strive for the same unity and internal desire to give that the early Christians had.
