The Last Enemy to be Destroyed

Powerless against death and often seeing the terrible ravages of aging, disease, or accidents, we, as human beings, fear the unknown and push far from us our inevitable succumbing to it—at least until this time of year. The more secular our society grows, however, the more those with no hope glorify death as the strongest power over us. Perhaps embracing their fear somehow makes them feel stronger against it?

Thus, it is not surprising that for younger generations, who have largely stopped attending religious services of any kind, Halloween has surpassed Christmas and Easter in its importance to them. Facing their fear head-on is the greatest spiritual experience that they know.

In this morning's lesson, "Lower Than the Angels," we'll this as an evangelistic opportunity for those with hope to share Christ's power over death through His resurrection with those who have no hope—that there is no longer any reason to fear death. Yes, we are indeed powerless against death, we might tell them, but we are not left without power. Our power is that in our weakness we trust in the One who has conquered death and the grave. And He gives us hope.

It is no wonder, then, that those around us who don't know the hope of Jesus' resurrection would prefer to think of death as a pleasant sleep or a complete ceasing to exist—beliefs that are becoming increasingly popular in our secular world. At the very best they are wishing for a God-less heaven as they believe that only the worst of sins (murder, rape, etc.) or powerful, demonic circumstances (in which they are innocent victims) would drag them off to hell.

In my evening lesson from Psalm 13, "The Sleep of Death," I'll show these worldly fallacies to be hope without hope and how in the context that that was not at all what David meant by that phrase. Rather, Israel's shepherd-king understood that without his trust in God's steadfast love and intervention in his life, he would surely die.

Knowing that God has dealt bountifully with him, David has salvation and hope ... for when he would die!
