Centennial Update ...

In just 15.5 months, we'll celebrate the 100th year of Christians worshiping, serving, and proclaiming the gospel from this property—48 years in a little white building on Pleasant Avenue that was renamed 34th Street and 52 years in a brick facility on the opposite corner as the 36th Street Church of Christ.

Initial efforts have brought us our electronic sign and the centennial store that lets us wear hoodies, shirts, and hats with our centennial logo to let the community know that something big is happening here. Later this year just before gift-giving season starts up again, we'll open the store once more with new items to equip us with gear to celebrate in style.

Also, we've collected many stories and materials to bring together our history that gives us a foundation for our future. Some of these things are in the beautiful cabinet in the back of the auditorium along with projects from skilled members that will mark this centennial for generations to come. This history, pictures, and anecdotes will be preserved in a 100-page coffee table book over the coming months and will be available for pre-order in 2024.

Just this past week, the work of putting together this book began in earnest as was securing Grand Pointe for a Saturday, May 25, 2024 (100 years to the day of our church's dedication service) banquet that will feature speakers, videos, and a Tom Butterfield original poem to celebrate our century. To bring down the cost for tickets for everyone to attend, we'll have a separate donation box in the foyer so that those who can contribute may help.

The work from various subcommittees is ongoing and they would certainly welcome your skills and involvement. Ask how you might help. Our seamstresses will come together on February 18 in the MPR to work on the centennial quilt. As the book takes shape, we'll need your pictures and memories to help us fill holes. And, as the year progresses, we'll need your help inviting those who've had a connection here to come home ring our month-long celebration in 2024.


