### Left Everything and Followed You

Oh, how we wag our heads at the rich young man as he, "disheartened" by Jesus' instructions to "sell all [he had] and give to the poor" to have "treasure in heaven," could not do it and "went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions" Mark 10:17-31! And, while we do this, we clutch our own possessions we're storing on earth, where moth and rust destroy, close to our hearts.

Instead, we identify with Peter and Jesus' other closest followers when he said, "See, we have left everything and followed you." But have we? The fiery 'Sons of Thunder,' James and John, left their father in the boat with hired hands to follow Jesus when He called them. As sons, they would have been expected to take over the family business. Leaving his livelihood, Levi, who would later write the Gospel of Matthew, "rose and followed" Jesus when the Savior passed his tax-collecting booth. And, after His resurrection, when Jesus showed Peter "by what kind of death he was to glorify God," He told him to "follow me" John 21:19.

We want the great reward that Jesus offers: "... there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and in the age to come eternal life." And though we hope to avoid those persecutions or that they will truly be "light and momentary affliction" according to earthly standards, we still hope for "an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison" while holding onto "the things that are seen" and are "transient" 2 Corinthians 4:17-18.

If we're honest, we're more like the rich young man than the apostles, and we must first leave everything before we can follow Jesus. How powerful the church would be if it was filled with disciples who didn't declare themselves followers first and then hoped what Jesus required of them was minimal in this life!


