

Besides a "we" passage that indicates that the writer, Luke, had rejoined Paul in the narrative, the beginning of Acts 20 has been known as proof that Christians in the 1st century held the Lord's Supper on Sundays ... and the Eutychus story. Often a way to poke fun at longwinded preachers or those who fall asleep in church, I've insisted by it that it's scriptural to preach to midnight! But have you considered what a great heart this young man had? A great evangelist was in Troas for a week-long gospel meeting. He had come through the city before (Acts 16:8). Perhaps Eutychus had obeyed the gospel then or had heard of Paul from others who had heard him proclaim how Jesus overcame death. He had likely risen early as a farmer or apprentice in whatever trade he was in, worked hard for long hours, and then listened intently for six evenings before crawling off to bed. But this seventh day was the first day of the week, and Paul spoke long because he was leaving the next day.

Thus, a young man with a hunger to hear God's Word preached fell asleep and then fell out of a third story window about midnight (and miraculously survived) while Paul "conversed with them a long while, until daybreak." Oh, for a Eutychus today, one of a younger generation who can deny all the distractions of our day and seek out opportunities to hear the words of life! Are you one?
